On page 1, under "BACKGROUND", revise the second paragraph as follows: The Department proposes to replace pavement, add new striping and retroreflective pavement markers, enhance bike lanes, rehabilitate the drainage systems currently in poor condition, improve shoulders, add Americans with Disability Act improvements, repair and replace existing failed sidewalks, add sidewalks to close gaps in current sidewalks, install new intersection lighting at the intersections of 8th and Flume and 9th and Flume Streets and traffic signals at 8th and Walnut and 9th and Walnut Streets. This project is currently programmed in the 2020 State Highway Operation and Protection Program (SHOPP) for a total of \$34,830,000, which includes Construction (capital and support). In the Book Item Memorandum:

On page 11, under C-22124, under "The Public interest and necessity require the proposed project", revise the first paragraph as follows:

This project proposes to construct an undercrossing near the intersection of United States (US) 101 and Wellsona Road. Construction work also includes approximately 2,400 feet of frontage road that will connect the undercrossing to Wellsona Road.

There is a two-way stop sign at the intersection of US 101 and Wellsona Road that has experienced a concentration of collisions due to drivers not yielding to vehicular right-of-way. These accidents have resulted in broadside, sideswipe and merge related collisions. In a five-year period between October 1, 2011 and September 30, 2016, this intersection experienced a total of 16 collisions, 14 of these were multivehicle. Three of the collisions included fatalities which resulted in six deaths. In addition, during a five-year period between January 1, 2016 and December 31, 2020, this intersection experienced an additional 15 collisions, all of which were multivehicle accidents. These collisions resulted in another 3 fatalities and 15 more injuries.

After the undercrossing is constructed, all at-grade, cross traffic, left turn traffic movements will be eliminated, thereby eradicating the primary safety issue at this intersection.
