Proposed Adoption of the 2022 TCEP Fund Estimate

- No changes made from the Draft Fund Estimate presented at the June Commission meeting
- Provides approximately \$1 billion of new programmable resources over the Fund Estimate period
- Department worked closely with Commission Staff during development of the Fund Estimate
- Department recommends the Commission adopt the 2022 TCEP Fund Estimate
- Anticipated to occur concurrently with adoption of the 2022 TCEP Guidelines
