Strategy S1: Safer Streets & Crossings

Address the safety of vulnerable users in roadway design and operations

Many leads throughout the state play a critical role in improving the safety of vulnerable users across all age groups using evidence-based roadway design. This effort includes increased separation, signal improvements, signage, and other strategies to reduce conflicts between vulnerable users and motorized traffic. Crossings of access-controlled facilities (freeways) and conventional highways are also considered in this process. Design strategies can reduce crime and improve personal safety by increasing visibility, increasing the number of people out walking and bicycling in an area, and "daylighting" dark areas or passageways to reduce potential hiding places.

Efforts continue in the proactive incorporation of design considerations that prioritize safety for people walking and bicycling. The following efforts were delivered in accordance with this strategy.


